(1) Work, Love & Play - The Genesis Model - Elaine Eng

"God saw all that He had made, and it was very good." - Genesis 1:31 - Can we glorify God in our work, love and play? Or are we facing difficulties in one or more of these areas? Are they out of balance? Do they enhance or hinder your testimony? In my training we were taught that the main problem people needed in psychotherapy was a proper approach to the areas of work, love and play. What does this mean for Christians? We will look at God's original intention as outlined in Genesis 1-4, the barriers to His plan for our lives and prescriptions for obtaining His will in these areas. We will discuss the ideas presented, share strategies for implementing God's word and pray so you will be able to glorify the Lord in these areas.

(2) Walking with the Wise: Discovering God's Will and Living in It-George Ibach

Does God have a will for my life? Can I know what His will is? Christians of all times have struggled with discerning God's will. From seemingly inconsequential decisions, like what pizza topping to order to the biggies like choosing a mate or vocation, this workshop will provide a fresh, step by step, biblical, and practical approach to making decisions that result in God's glory and our good.

(3) Calling & Career - Julie Chien

If you just don't hear God calling you into full time ministry, then what? If you are in or pursuing a secular career, what is God's calling in the midst of the mundane, or perhaps even drudgery of the workplace? Where are you in your career and is it where God wants you to be? How do you decide what career to pursue and/or on the next steps in your career?

(4) Coaching as a primary way of discipleship - Mike Gerhardt

We are called to make disciples, but what does that mean? Have you heard of life coaching? My recent experience has changed my thoughts on coaching. It is now a primary way to make disciples. When we coach another person, we always have in mind their best interests. By asking strategic questions, we hope to help a person achieve their calling from God and advance His Kingdom in their life. I will share my experience and give you a taste of what coaching is all about and how it is different than mentoring and mutual accountability.

(5) What Did you Expect? - Shirley Ng

We all have expectations and assumptions which we place upon our friends, boyfriends, girlfriends, employers, church leaders, the church, just to name a few. Expectations are a part of life. The problem is that when their presence is not recognized, acknowledged or mishandled conflicts can arise and true fellowship is broken. The challenge is to become aware and unearth these hidden expectations so that we can have deep, honest and true relationships and learn to love others well.

(6) Deception - Stephen Ro

Sin is deceptive. Our minds and our hearts are deceptive. Thus we are masters of self-justification. Self-justification serves as a good inroad into our need for the gospel; though we may not struggle with adultery, drugs, financial fraud, we all justify ourselves as easily and automatically as we breathe the air. We will consider some common excuses or "lies" we make up to justify our sinful hearts and behaviors. Then we will look at how the gospel encourages and challenges us to be more truthful to ourselves and others.
